
The world of wine is rich and complex,

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## *Sangiovese from Toscana*

Tuscany's most famous contribution to the world of wine is Sangiovese, and in my opinion it is the perfect companion to the bistecca alla Fiorentina. The combination of acidity and tannin in these wines offers a perfect counterpoint to the richness of the bistecca, without overshadowing what should be, after all, the main event!

Sangiovese is grown throughout Toscana, often known by local names, and sometimes blended with other grapes. These wines vary from light and aromatic to more savoury and earthy.

## *Brunello di Montalcino*

Further south, the hill of Montalcino is the home of Brunello - the traditional name of Sangiovese in this area. Only the best grapes are made into Brunello di Montalcino, which must be aged for 5 years before release.

Traditionally these wines were built for long ageing, with most requiring a minimum of 20 years before coming into their own. More recently, modern winemaking techniques have begun to take hold in Montalcino, and nowadays plenty of Brunelli can be enjoyed upon release.

Brunello is a powerful expression of Sangiovese, rich in its youth and with great elegance after a few years in the bottle. Layered and complex, it is a wine to savour.

## Super Tuscans - The Rebels

Why 'Rebels'? By the end of the 1960s, a few winemakers in Toscana felt a bit too restricted by Italian wine law, which dictated quite strictly how to make wine, which grapes to use and in what percentages. Some wineries decided to follow their own rules, choosing which grapes to grow and how to blend them. As these wines didn't meet local regulations, they had to be labelled as 'Table Wine' - the lowest indication of quality at the time. However, they were soon recognised as wines of great quality, and now are perhaps the most sought-after wines that Italy produces.

There is great variety in the following wines, ranging from elegant and earthy to fleshy and rich. International varieties are common, often blended with local grapes, to produce something uniquely Tuscan.
